Road Upgrades



Opāheke Road, Ponga Road and Waihoehoe Road (east)

O MAY **2020**

We're proposing safe, separated walking and cycling paths along Opāheke Road, Ponga Road and Waihoehoe Road.

These upgrades will give people more active transport choices, allowing them to walk or cycle to public transport and connect to where they live, work, study, shop and play.

Opāheke Road

Widening generally on the north-eastern side is our preferred option because it:

- reduces impacts on live-zoned property, reducing impact on immediate housing supply (does not decrease the footprint for development)
- has less impact on the Opāheke Reserve and conservation-zoned land
- reduces impacts on utilities.

Ponga Road

Widening generally on the southern side is our preferred option because it:

- reduces property impacts
- reduces the impact on mature trees on the northern side of the road corridor which contribute to ecological, heritage and amenity values.

Waihoehoe Road (east)

Widening generally on the northern side is our preferred option because it reduces property impacts.


